

Alternative Placement Information for Running Start Students

In order to be eligible for the Running Start program at Everett Community College (EvCC), students must place into both math and English. However, it does not have to be college-level placement (classes above 100). Non-college level placement in math is primarily determined through the EvCC Accuplacer assessment or high school transcript evaluation. Placement evaluation can be determined with the following documents.
