

## Alternative Placement Information for Running Start Students

In order to be eligible for the Running Start program at Everett Community College (EvCC), students must place into both math and English. However, it does not have to be college-level placement (classes above 100). Non-college level placement in math is primarily determined through the EvCC Accuplacer assessment or high school transcript evaluation. Placement evaluation can be determined with the following documents.

### HIGH SCHOOL AND HOMESCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

<p>At least a 2.5 cumulative GPA will give placement in to ENGL&amp;101 (English Composition).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>An unofficial copy of a Washington State high school or homeschool transcript that has first semester grades of the current academic year and cumulative GPA.</li> <li>Out-of-state transcripts are not accepted.</li> </ul>	<p>Completion of a high school math class within t years.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Full year completed of the math class showing two semester grades or one credit.</li> <li>If only one semester of a course has been completed, the current grade of the second semester can be demonstrated with 1) a screenshot of the student portal or progress report or 2) a signed note or email from the high school math teacher indicating the current second semester grade.</li> <li>Pass/Fail or Credit/No Credit grades are not used.</li> </ul> <p>If you have not completed the math course or documentation is missing, we will use the previous year math course for placement evaluation.</p>

<p><b>Rapid Directed Self-Placement Form</b> (20-30 minutes)</p> <p>A self-reflection process about academic preparation, skills-confidence, and preferences to help students choose their own English placement.</p>	<p><b>Directed Self Placement Tool</b> (1-2 hours)</p> <p>A test that assesses your reading and writing skills and makes a placement recommendation for you. You will have the choice between accepting your placement recommendation or scheduling a follow-up English Placement Consultation.</p>
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### ACCUPLACER PLACEMENT TEST IN MATH (\$33.70 FEE) – EverettCC.edu/Testing

You can take the Accuplacer test in one of the following scenarios. The placement testing fee is \$33.70

- Math placement is below college level and you want to achieve higher placement.
- Placement could not be determined based on your high school transcript or test scores.
- High school transcript or test scores are missing.

Everett Community College does not offer the Accuplacer Placement Test in English.
