- ♦ If you feel you need assistance to meet your college costs, "EvCC's Guide to Financing Your Education" and the Free Application for Federal Financial Aid are available through our Financial Aid Office. Applications for aid should be filed at least eight weeks in advance of the term you wish to start in order to receive timely notice of eligibility.
- ♦ Take our Entry Skills Assessment if you plan to take more than seven credits, you are seeking a certificate or degree, or if you will be taking courses that require specific levels of math and/or writing skills. If you have already completed college-level courses in Writing and/or Math, you may be eligible for a placement test waiver. Contact Enrollment Services for further information.
- ♦ Call us if you have questions about getting started, selecting courses, transfer credit, etc.

Am I eligible for admission and registration?

You are eligible if you are age 18 or older, or if you have completed high school or a GED.

Do I need to submit my high school or other college transcripts?

You are not required to submit transcripts from your high school or other colleges when you apply. However, we recommend that you do so, since your previous transcript(s) can assist us in determining course prerequisites. If you wish to earn a certificate or degree from EvCC, and if you have already taken some college courses, via another college or earned credits through College in the High School, or have scores from an AP test, you should submit the official transcript and request a transfer credit evaluation from Enrollment Services. An official transcript is one which is mailed directly from the previous college(s) or testing agency to this office, or that you submit in a sealed envelope.

Can I find help in choosing a career and/or program of study?

How can I get financial aid?

Apply for aid by completing a financial aid application available through the Financial Aid Office or your high school counselor. Don’t delay! It takes some time to process the financial aid application. To apply on the web, go to www.fafsa.ed.gov/. Our federal school code is 003776.

Do I need to take an entry test?

Entry skills assessment is required for new students. Don’t worry! This is not a pass or fail test. The assessment helps you and your advisor select the right level of courses. The fee is \$25.

Can I attend part-time and still earn a degree?

Many of our students attend school on a part-time basis, perhaps taking one or two classes per quarter. This may extend the time it takes to earn a degree, so we recommend staying in close touch with your advisor to assure that you are on track.

Should I apply for admission if I am not quite sure when I will attend?

Please apply for the quarter that you think you will be starting your studies. If your plans change, contact us and ask us to update your application to another quarter.
