

Winter Quarter Registration

Beginning Winter 2010, Running Start students can now register online!!! Go to www.everettcc.edu/kiosk to find out your appointment/turn to register for Winter Quarter 2010. **You have to submit your signed Authorization form to Enrollment Services in order to access online registration for Winter Quarter.** You can turn in your authorization form to Enrollment Services as early as November 2, and then be able to go online to register on your appointment time.

****Remember**, you have to meet with your high school counselor **BEFORE** you register for your college classes, so contact your high school counselor **now** to make an advising appointment with them.

Registering on-time is the best strategy in getting the classes that you want. While we **NEVER** guarantee you a spot in any class, more students get what they need when they register on-time. Pay attention to details.

2010 Seniors take note!

I know it's hard to think about life after senior year, but its coming! University application deadlines for Fall 2010 are fast approaching. If you know where you want to go, be sure to have all your application materials submitted by that school's deadline.

University of Washington – December 1

University of Washington Bothell – January 15

Washington State Univ – January 31

Eastern Washington Univ – February 15

Western Washington Univ – March 1 (Dec 1 for housing)

Central Washington Univ – April 1

Keep in mind when applying to university after your senior year, you will be applying as a Freshman, and following all rules and deadlines that apply to freshman applications. You will still get to transfer any credits you have earned here, but freshman application deadlines and rules are different, so do your research.

Campus closure information – Sign up for Emergency notification via text or email by going to www.everettcc.edu/emergency The college does post closure information online and informs local media, but the text message updates are the best, fastest way for you to know!

Running Start students **do not** have the option of auditing a class, unless you are willing to pay the tuition yourself.

Don't forget to explore Financial Aid! 2010-2011 applications will be available as of January 1, 2010. Apply even if you think you don't qualify – you could be pleasantly surprised.

Waitlist – should you? There are a variety of factors that go into deciding to go onto a waitlist. If you place yourself on a waitlist, be sure to check your waitlist status periodically online, and **GO TO CLASS** on the first day!!! Ask in Enrollment Services if you have questions.

\$\$\$\$\$ **Don't forget** – Running Start **WON'T** pay for classes numbered under 100, like Math 081, 082, 090 and 099. If you register for those, you **WILL** owe tuition for them. Don't be surprised to get a bill for that class!

Running Start students are responsible for paying all class, lab and technology fees. See information at www.everettcc.edu/tuition (then click on information about fees) to see a breakdown of fees. If you qualify for free/reduced lunches at your high school, you can apply for a fee waiver. Go to www.everettcc.edu/runningstart and click on Fee waiver application.

Pay attention to what's going on at your high school. Appointments to keep? Deadlines to watch for? Senior project details can sneak up on you! Stay in touch with your high school counselor and don't miss out!
