What is it?


MagillOnLiterature Plus is a literary database that provides full-text critical analyses, plot summaries, character sketches, and author biographies for prominent works of literature, including fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and drama. Works may originate from any country and any time period.

How do I start?

Accessible through the library homepage <http://www.evcc.ctc.edu/library> by clicking on 'All Databases listed by title' and scrolling down the page. Off-campus users will be prompted to enter their EvCC student or staff ID number.

How do I search?

Fill in one or more boxes on the search screen with your keywords (i.e. author, title of work, etc.). You can search one field or multiple fields. See image on reverse side for more options to limit your search. Click on the search button once you've entered all the criteria for your search.
