## GENERAL INFORMATION

The Associate of Science (AS) degree is designed to allow science students to prepare for their university major by completing many or all of the first- and second-year math and science courses at the community college. During the first two years at the community college, students follow a specific outline of courses for their major, and also take general education courses in the humanities and social sciences. Then, when at the university, qualified students pursue their major, as well as complete the remaining general education courses required for a bachelor's degree.

Students who earn this degree and meet the minimum grade point average required for admission by the transfer institution will receive the same priority admission as students earning the AAS – Option II degree<sup>1</sup>, and will transfer with junior standing to the following universities: Central Washington University, Eastern Washington University, The Evergreen State College, Washington State University, Western Washington University, University of Washington, Gonzaga University, Seattle Pacific University, Seattle University, Pacific Lutheran University, and Whitworth College.

These are not the only schools, however, which may regard your Associate of Science degree as appropriate preparation. The schools listed above are the schools with which EvCC has entered into a transfer agreement for the purpose of helping Associate of Science students gain priority admission status. The courses you are taking as part of the degree are generally applicable to the

<sup>1</sup> In addition to the transferable AS degree, EvCC also offers the Associate in Arts and Sciences – Option II, which enables students to qualify for priority admission to most regional universities, and enables them to prepare for a variety of majors, including the sciences. However, the Option II degree requires a large number of general education courses which may preclude completing some key science prerequisites for some science majors.

requirements of many schools. You should discuss your university options with an advisor from that institution.

## SELECTING YOUR MAJOR

*EvCC provides “curriculum guides” in a variety of science majors that describe the major and career options, and include a checklist of specific requirements. Each curriculum guide lists the advisor(s) associated with that major. You should acquire a copy of the guide in the major of your choice and contact an advisor.*

You should also contact one or more universities to review their offerings and admission criteria. Each university may have some unique requirements in addition to the general preparation.

## DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The requirements for an Associate of Science degree are listed in separate curriculum guides for each program, such as Biological Sciences, Physics, etc. In addition to the required science, math and English courses, at least 15 credits are required in the Humanities and Social Sciences. A diversity course must also be completed, and may be used to satisfy one of the other requirements; diversity courses are denoted with a “D” in the course number, such as ANTH&115D. The list of Humanities and Social Science courses allowed for the Associate of Science degree is on the reverse side of this guide.

To earn an EvCC degree, students must complete a diversity course, and at least 90 credits with a minimum 2.0 GPA. A full description of eligibility requirements to earn an EvCC degree can be found in the Catalog.

## GETTING STARTED AT EVCC

Our Enrollment Services Office provides information about application, advising, orientation and registration for new and continuing students.
