## FIRE SERVICE MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION DEGREE (ATA)

### GENERAL INFORMATION

The Associate in Technical Arts (ATA) degree in **Fire Service Management and Administration** is designed for advancement in the fire service. We have structured this program to prepare and develop leaders in the fire service. The basic principles of planning and prevention, communicating, managing resources, leading others and incident management are covered in this degree. There are two plans available Plan (A) Administrative training includes managing projects, preparing budgets, organizational structure, and knowledge of laws pertaining to the fire service. Plan (B) Management training includes operational procedures, incident management, and health and safety procedures. Certificates can be accomplished for each of the plans. With this broad based knowledge approach we will empower leaders and managers to continue to learn about their areas of expertise and the need to maintain currency and effectiveness.

This is a self-support program that receives limited state funds. The fees for these classes do not correspond to the tuition charged for a class of similar credit. This Degree course scheduling is primarily online or hybrid classes that are offered and can be accomplish in two years.

### OTHER FIRE SCIENCE AND EMT PROGRAMS AT EVCC

EvCC also offers an Associate in Applied Science-T Degree in Fire Science. The AAS-T is transferable to Western Oregon University, toward a Bachelor of Science in Fire Administration. The Fire Fighter Academy (FIRE 100) prepares you for the Washington State Fire Fighter (FF1, II, Hazardous-Materials Awareness and Operations) written and practical examinations. Students successfully completing Emergency Medical Training (EMS 151) are eligible to take the Washington State National Registry EMT examination. EvCC also offers the annual Competency Based Training (CBT) course required to maintain the EMT certification. EvCC is a NREMT test site.
