PROFICIENCY in Intermediate Algebra for AAS/DTA Option II only

This is a graduation requirement for which no credit may be applied to this degree. May be satisfied by completion of high school mathematics through second year algebra, or completion of an intermediate algebra course (Math 065), or course challenge demonstrating mastery of intermediate algebra skills, or completion of one of the following: Math 140 (with a grade of C or higher), 142, 147, 152, 153, 154, 252, 260, 261, or equivalent. COMPLETION of a Diversity Course for both AAS and DTA Option II and AGS

Diversity courses focus on perspectives related to diversity in our society. Courses are listed in the Class Schedule with a D in the course number, for example, ANTHR 202D. They are typically found in the categories below Communications, Humanities, Social Sciences and Transfer Electives. A "D" course may count toward one of the requirements listed below, as well as meet the Diversity Course requirement. In each quarterly class schedule, courses that meet this requirement will be listed. Please consult an advisor with any questions.
