1. INTRODUCTION

This appendix to the Training Annex (Annex #6) identifies the minimum incident command management (ICS) training for Everett Community College. These standards fulfill the requirements of the National Incident Management System (NIMS).

2. NIMS REQUIREMENTS

- A The Everett Community College is required to determine which personnel need to receive incident command and other NIMS training based on their role(s) in the schools emergency management program.
- B In accordance with the U.S. Department of Education (ED) guidance, certain "key personnel are required to complete the following courses in order for an individual or organization to be considered NIMS compliant through FY2010.
 - 1. ICS100 A Introduction to the Incident Command System
 - 2. ICS200 ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents
 - 3. ICS300 Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents
 - 4. ICS400 Advanced Incident Command System
 - 5. ICS700 NIMS, In Introduction
 - 6. ICS800 National Response Framework, An Introduction
- C. EvCC has established four personnel groups for the purpose of determining minimum ICS training requirements necessary to fulfill NIMS requirements. The characteristics of these groups are detailed in *TABLE #001 "Key ICS Personnel Groups."*
- D. The minimum ICS training standards necessary for each of the Key ICS personnel groups are detailed in *TABLE #002 "ICS Training Requirements."*
