



GENERAL INFORMATION

If you are interested in completing your high school diploma with EvCC, you should consider following this diploma program guide. This document is for students in Youth Re-Engagement (U3), International HS, and the HSC/21+ programs only. It is intended to be used **ONLY** after a student has enrolled in U3, International programs, or for students who have had their transcripts evaluated by the HSC program.

WHO IS THIS DOCUMENT FOR?

This document in intended for students who are obtaining their high school diploma through Everett Community College ONLY. This document is <u>NOT for Running</u> <u>Start students</u>. This will benefit students that plan on taking courses in order to complete their high school diploma requirements for a diploma FROM Everett Community College only. This document will be most beneficial to Youth Re-Engagement (U3) students and International HS students.

Everett Community College is authorized by state law to award an adult high school diploma to students who complete the minimum number of credits required by Washington State and any additional state requirements. These credits and additional requirements vary depending on the student's class year. Your High School Completion staff will go over these requirments with you at your appointment.

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DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

- Students must complete all required coursework for their particular class year and meet all other requirements, such as state testing (see Chapter 180-51 of the Washington State Administrative Code for more information). You can also see the High School Completion staff for assistance.
- For the traditional High School Completion program, courses must be completed with a grade of 'D' or above. For HS21+, courses from Everett Community College must be completed with a grade of 'C' or higher.
- Courses may be applied toward only one distribution area, even if listed as usable in more than one area.
- A minimum of 2 credits must be earned through Everett Community College, and all other courses can be transferred in from other accredited institutions in order to be awarded a diploma from Everett Community College.
- The college reserves the right to not accept credits from other institutions they find to be not accredited.
- A student's last class must be taken through Everett Community College in order to have the diploma awarded by the college.
- Students under the age of 21 will have additional nonclass requirements to follow (see HS Evaluation Sheet given to student during their first step for details).
- Students must meet the all-high school graduation requirements listed as state law mandates.
- Students 21 years of age or older who complete an Associate degree are eligible to request their high school diploma <u>without</u> having to meet any specific high school diploma requirements (see: <u>http://www.sbe.wa.gov/faq/diploma.php</u>).

TO APPLY FOR THE DIPLOMA

To apply for your diploma, please make an appointment with the High School Completion staff, and they will do one final check to make sure you have met all of your requirements and will have you complete your diploma application with them. **Please schedule this appointment the quarter before your final quarter of course work or when you have already satisfied all degree requirements.** (If you will complete your degree requirements Summer Qtr. and wish to participate in June Commencement, you should apply during Winter Qtr.) To assure completion of necessary paperwork before the end of your final quarter, you should apply within the first two weeks of your second to last quarter.
