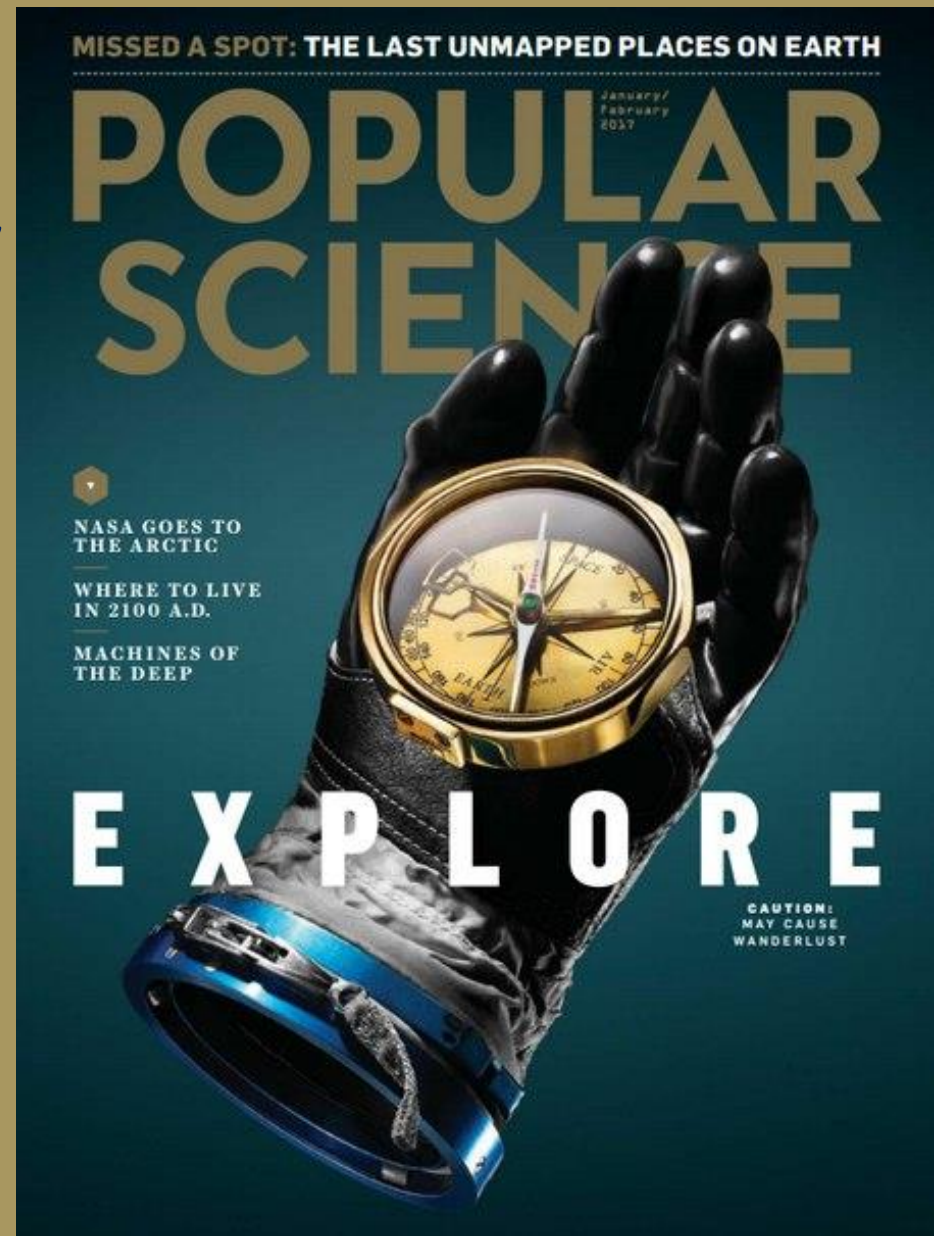

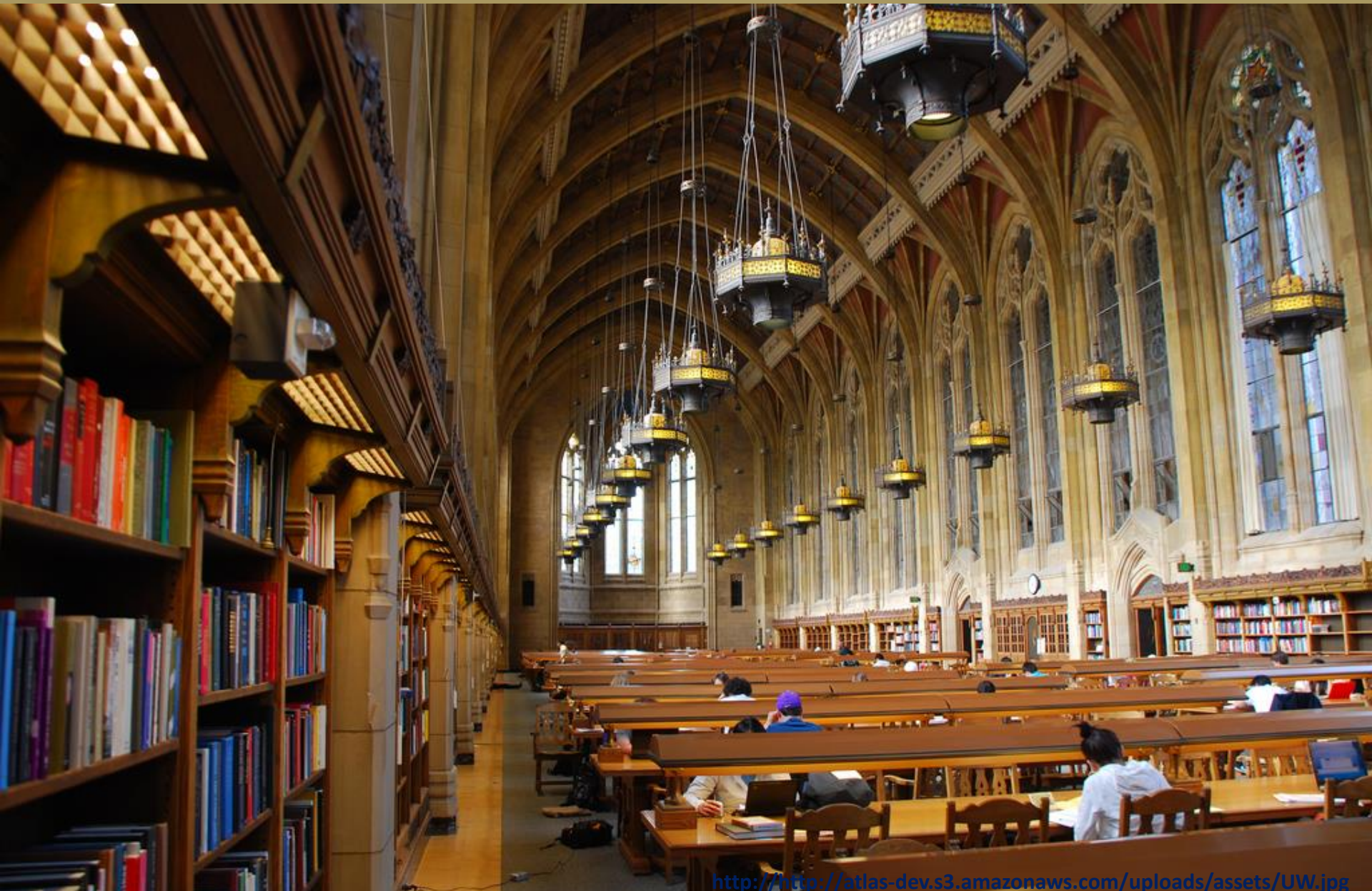

Borrowing

Everett Community College student ID cards are used to check out materials. Cards are available free to registered EvCC students in the Student Activities Service Center, 2nd floor, Parks Student Union. In lieu of the student ID card, other photo identification is required: either a driver's license, passport, military ID or Washington State ID card is acceptable.

Most materials may be checked out for **three weeks**. Material can be renewed by phone unless requested by another borrower. Newspapers, magazines, reference materials, and most media materials, including videos, may be used in the library. Course Reserves

Faculty often place materials, such as **textbooks**, answer keys and course-related articles on reserve at the check-out desk. Most of these materials are for use in the library only but must still be checked out with a library card.

Interlibrary Loan

Occasionally, students may need books or articles that are not available in the library. Librarians at the reference desk can usually help order these materials from other libraries at no cost to the student. Students must have a current EvCC Student ID card or proof of registration and photo ID.

Is a new cold war emerging?

President-elect Donald Trump and Russian President Vladimir Putin appear on a billboard in Montenegro, placed there by a pro-Serbian group sympathetic to Russia, a week after Trump's victory. U.S. intelligence officials say Putin directed Russian hackers to try to tilt the U.S. election in Trump's favor. Trump's disparagement of U.S.

With Donald Trump's inauguration only days away, U.S. intelligence officials have raised new concerns about relations between the United States and Russia. A report released on Jan. 6 concluded that "an influence campaign" ordered by Russian President Vladimir Putin was designed to damage Hillary Clinton and help elect Trump. The president-elect, who has had longstanding business ties with Russian investors, has angered leaders in both parties by praising Putin's leadership skills and downplaying U.S. intelligence officials' claims that Russian hackers tried to influence the 2016 election. Trump also has stirred controversy by nominating an oil executive with previous business dealings in Russia to head the State Department. Meanwhile, Putin has aggressively pushed to re-establish the country's geopolitical importance by annexing part of Ukraine, joining Iran in supporting Syrian strongman Bashar al-Assad and using hackers and fake news to promote populist candidates and discredit democracy in Europe. In response, the United States and European Union have imposed economic sanctions and bolstered NATO defenses in Central Europe.

Overdoses of opioid drugs, including powerful prescription painkillers and heroin, have killed almost 250,000 Americans since 2000, leading many experts to compare the crisis to the HIV and AIDS epidemics. Opioid addiction, once largely an urban minority affliction, has spread to every corner of the United States, hitting young adults and white people especially hard. One study has found that more adults use prescription painkillers than cigarettes, smokeless tobacco and cigars combined. As opioid abuse grows, propelled in part by a flood of cheap heroin from Mexico, alarmed authorities are trying to figure out how to fight back. In July, President Obama signed a bill encouraging the expansion of treatment programs and the development of alternatives to opioid painkillers. But many experts are divided over how best to help opioid addicts. Some advocate providing them with limited doses to control their addiction, while others say that such an approach would make the crisis worse.

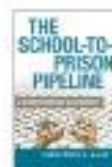

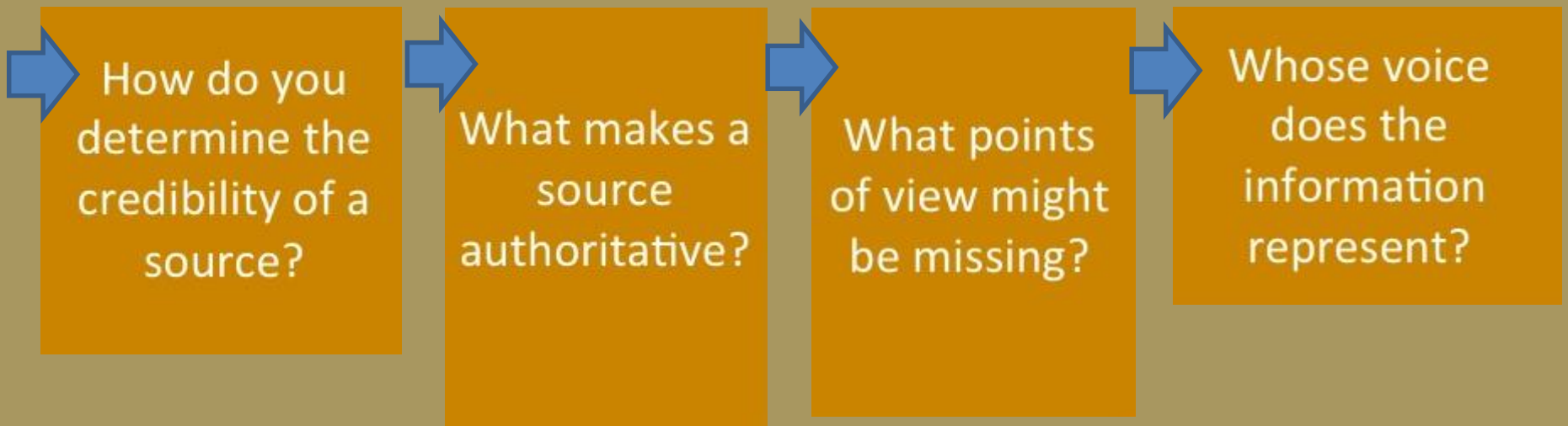

What is information literacy?

Authority is Constructed and Contextual

Think critically about information – whether it's from a blog post, a book, or a peer-reviewed journal article. Ask questions about the author(s), the purpose, and the context of the information. Recognize the value of diverse ideas and world views.



Information resources reflect their creators' expertise and credibility, and are evaluated based on the information need and the context in which the information will be used. Authority is constructed in that various communities may recognize different types of authority. It is contextual in that the information need may help to determine the level of authority required.

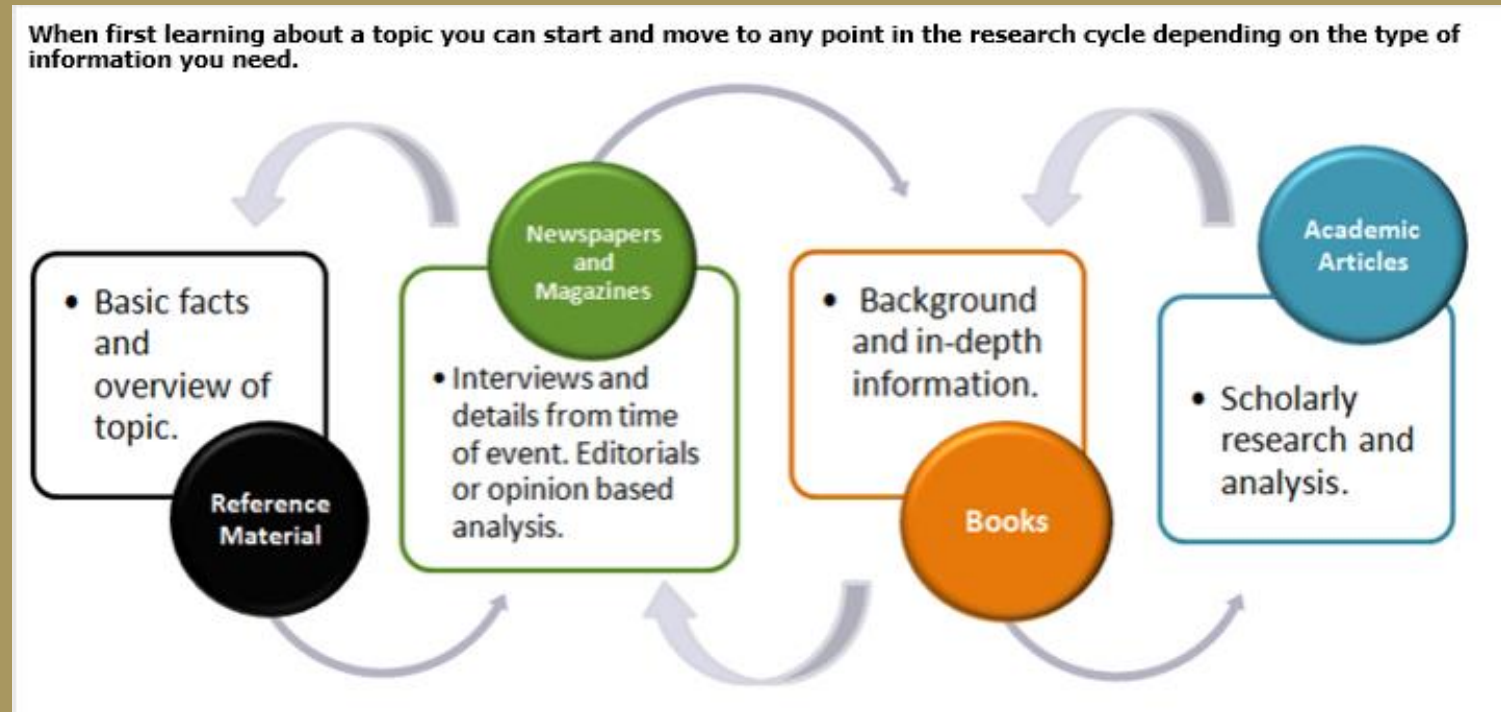

Information Creation as Process

Consider the characteristics of information resources that indicate how and for whom they were created. Understand that information may be perceived differently based on the format in which it is presented.



Information in any format is produced to convey a message and is shared via a selected delivery method. The iterative processes of researching, creating, revising, and dissemination information vary, and the resulting product reflects these differences.

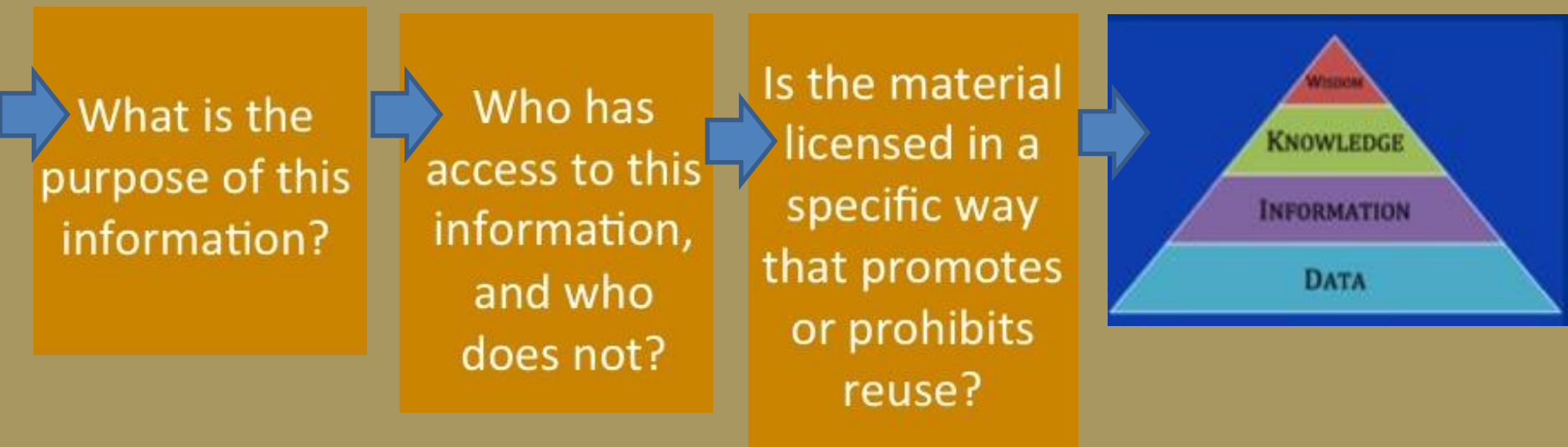

Legal and socio-economic interests influence information production and dissemination.

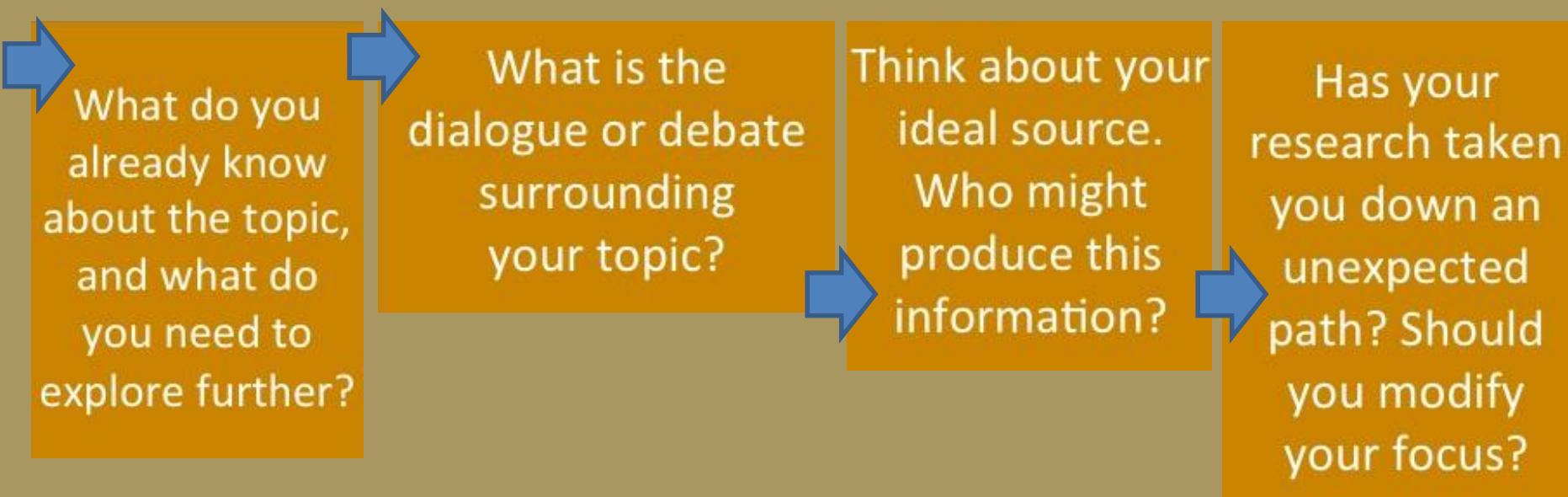

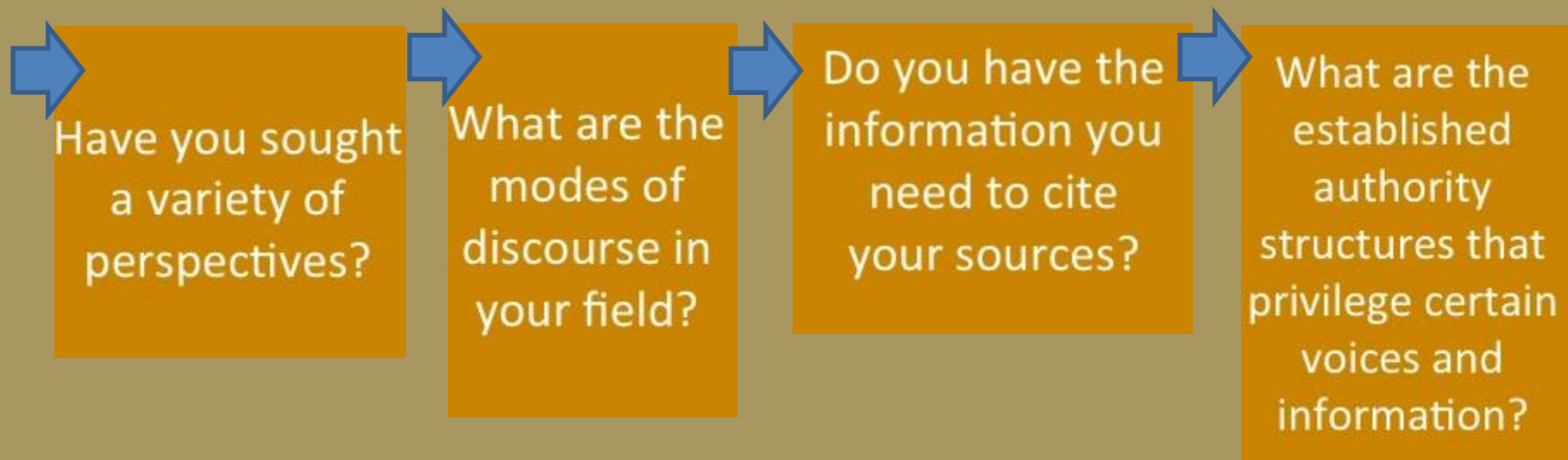

You have an opportunity to contribute to the conversation!



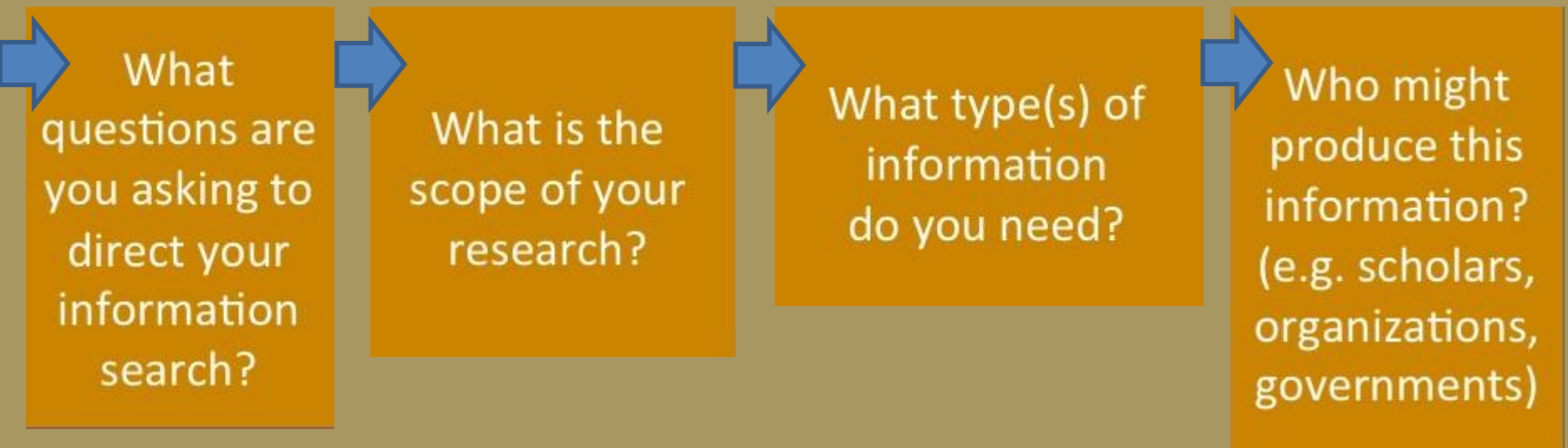
Communities of scholars, researchers, or professionals engage in sustained discourse with new insights and discoveries occurring over time as a result of varied perspectives and interpretations.

Searching as Strategic Exploration

Realize that information sources vary in content, format, and relevance to your needs, depending on the nature of your search and the scope of your research.
Be flexible and understand that your first attempts at searching are just the starting point.
Keep asking questions!



Searching for information is often nonlinear and iterative, requiring the evaluation of a range of information sources and the mental flexibility to pursue alternate avenues as new understanding develops.

- Or is it an organization? Purpose of organization?

Accuracy

- Edited well? Spelling or grammar errors?

Currency

- When was it written, posted, or published?
- Last revisions? Last updated?

Purpose

- To inform? To persuade? To sell?

What is Primo?

Primo Search is a search engine that covers millions of electronic, print and audiovisual resources available through our library. It presents the search results in a relevancy-ranked list. Begin your search for materials here and refine your results with additional options provided on the left side of the results screen.



Primo Search includes most of the databases and journals that you already use. Some databases and e-journals provide full-text resources. Others include only the citation information so that you can easily request full-text through interlibrary loan.

Almost everything our library subscribes to is included in Primo Search. However, there are some resources that are not accessible. For a complete search of your topic, you may also visit our list of individual databases.
