Land Use, Natural Resource Management, and Sustainability. On three REQUIRED field trips (each up to 6 hours in length) to multi-use parks and public lands, students learn how land is managed for multiple user groups (hikers, mountain bikers, off-road vehicle enthusiasts, boaters, fishermen, Equestrians, etc.). With DNR forest managers, students learn about natural resource management in Washington state. Volunteering for the Lord Hill Regional Park & the US Forest Service, students get to experience the value of citizen service in taking care of our wilderness and public lands. Students then visit a recreation campsite that is unmanaged and at risk of being lost to public use. In the online portion of the class, students learn to research and write a research essay to solve this location's problems. (Required field trips dates: July 9, 16 and 23. An additional fee is added to this class to cover the field trip costs.)
