<p>American Association of Professional Coders</p> <p>(AAPC)</p> <p>*Exciting Note: The AAPC has reviewed the Career Step program and practicum we use, and because of this training, AAPC will remove one of the two required years of the apprenticeship when students pass the Career Step final exam. Students will only need to have one additional year of experience after graduating and passing the AAPC's CPC to meet their requirements.</p>	<p><u>CPC-A®</u> Certified Professional Coder - Apprentice</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The CPC® certification validates proficiency in the correct application of CPT®, HCPCS Level II procedure and supply codes, and ICD-10-CM diagnosis codes used for coding and billing for medical claims in a physician's office. Members with an apprentice designation are not required to have two years medical coding experience. Candidates who have taken the exam and were unsuccessful must wait a minimum of 90 days.
