# WAYS TO PAY FOR COLLEGE

There are many ways to help you pay for college. Here are a few options to look into.

Note: You should never pay money to apply for financial aid or scholarships.

### 1. Financial Aid

When you're looking for money for college, the best place to start is by filling out the online Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA). WASFA is only for undocumented and select non-citizens who are Washington state residents.

#### **Grants**

Grants are free money for college that you don't have to repay. They are awarded on the basis of need. Grants include:

- Federal Pell Grants
- Federal Supplemental Grants
- Washington College Grant
- Tuition waivers and EvCC grants

#### **Work Study**
